You may only receive the Body of Christ in the hand. There will be no Precious Blood, no holding hands at the Our Father and no shaking hands at the sign of peace. A six-foot distance must be maintained unless you are members of the same household.

All Masses will be held in the center's social hall. The daily Masses, Saturday, 5:30 p.m. Mass, the 8 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Mass will be in the center's social hall. The chairs have been spaced for distancing and we ask that you not move these chairs to help with spacing and cleaning.

We will need lectors for the weekend Masses. If you are willing to lector, please let Catherine know.

Mission San Rafael will also be holding Mass at the usual time, Sundays at 12:30 p.m.

Saint Michael the Archangel will have Mass on Sundays at 5:00 p.m.

If you are feeling ill in any way, please do not attend.

We are grateful that we will have the opportunity to receive Eucharist once again and to begin to slowly gather as a church family.
