Homily for the 4th Sunday in Lent (Cycle B)

2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23 Psalm 137:1-6 Ephesians 2:4-10 John 3:14-21

"**God is rich i**n mercy; because of His great love for us He brought us to life with Christ when we were dead in sin. By this favor you were saved." – Ephesians 2:4-5

Today is traditionally called "Laetare Sunday." "Laetare" means "rejoice," for Lent is half over and Easter is only three weeks away. We rejoice not because we don't have to fast for much longer but because God has already done marvelous works this Lent, and this is only the beginning.

What are you expecting for Holy Week and the Easter season? Do you expect a fifty-day Sunday for the Easter season? No matter how high your hopes, the Lord will do more than you could ever ask or imagine (Eph 3:20). "Is it possible that He Who did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for the sake of us all will not grant us all things besides?" (Rm 8:32)

After God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son (Jn 3:16), we can only underestimate the love, grace, and glory God has in store for us (1 Cor 2:9). He "gave us a place in the heavens, that in the ages to come He might display the great wealth of His favor" (Eph 2:6-7). We are so small and closed in on ourselves. God is so great and lavish in His love. How can the ocean of God's love be poured into the thimble of our selfishness? "Open wide your hearts!" (2 Cor 6:13)

Prayer: Father, I'm sorry I've been too self-centered to receive Your love. I repent. Do anything You want to open wide my heart.

Promise: "Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of His people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!" –2 Chr 36:23

Praise: "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His kindness endures forever" (Ps 106:1).

What Does It Mean for Jesus to Be "Begotten"?

The term begotten can certainly involve sexual relations, but that really does depend upon context because begotten can be used in non-sexual contexts as well. For example, in Acts 13:32–33: And we bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus; as also it is written in the second psalm, "Thou art my son, today I have begotten thee."

Would your friend attempt to say that sex is involved in raising someone from the dead? I should hope not! If he did, he would be just plain wrong! Thus, in Catholic and biblical theology, Christ was "begotten" in three senses. And none of them involve sex. 1. He was "begotten" of Mary through a miraculous and non-sexual conception and birthing. And our Muslim friends agree with us in this instance! Jesus being "begotten" of Mary did not involve sex in either Catholic or Muslim theology. 2. He was "eternally begotten" of the Father (Col. 1:15–16; John 3:16, etc.), and that has nothing to do with sex because God is pure and infinite spirit. And 3. He was "begotten from the dead" as we just saw.

So, we see that biblically speaking, and in the language of the Church, begotten can involve sexual relations in some contexts, but we really have to examine the context in which the term begotten is being used. Even in common parlance, we say in English things like "Luxuries beget vice," or "Virtue begets virtue," and so forth. The term itself can simply mean that the former is the first principle of the latter, like the Father is the first principle of life in the Blessed Trinity. That does not mean that he sexually produced the Son any more than "luxury" had sex to "beget vice." Both would be absurd! But it does mean that he is the source of the life of the Blessed Trinity. Not in time, for that too would be absurd. Rather, he eternally begets the Son and along with the Son eternally spirates the Holy Spirit. No sex involved!
