Homily for the 3rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Cycle B)

1Jonah 3:1-5, 10/ Psalm 25:4-9/ 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Mark 1:14-20

LIKE A FISH OUT OF WATER

"They immediately abandoned their nets and became His followers." –Mark 1:18

When a fish is caught and taken out of the water, it will die. Its former watery way of life "is passing away" (1 Cor 7:31). Similarly, everything changes when we enter into the kingdom of God. Living in God's kingdom is as different from our pre-Christian life as is life for that fish trying to live on land. Lifestyles that worked underwater no longer work in fresh air. In order for the fish to live on land, that fish would need to receive a new nature.

So it is with us human beings. To live in the kingdom of God, we die to our old nature in Baptism; we then become "sharers of the divine nature" (2 Pt 1:4) when we rise from the waters of Baptism. Now our old lifestyle won't work. Once we begin living the new, baptized life in Christ, we can no longer live the lifestyle we had before Christ. We must discard those things we used to do before we gave ourselves to Jesus (see Eph 4:22-24). We can no longer live as do the nonbelievers (1 Pt 4:2-3). We die to ourselves, pick up our cross each day, follow Jesus (Lk 9:23), and live the new lifestyle that befits a member of the household of God (1 Tm 3:15).

Are you struggling to live a godly life? Are you having a hard time breathing the risen air? Maybe you're not dead yet. Beg Jesus to crucify your old nature (Gal 5:24) and raise you up to life to the full (Jn 10:10).

<u>Prayer:</u> Father, I want everything You have for me. I want it all. Take everything that keeps me from You. Give me Your risen life.

Things to Prepare ◆ Bible

- A shelf or table where the Bible will be placed (the shelf may be adorned with a cloth and candles)

Ritual

When possible, the ritual may start outside the main door to the house or outside the main entrance to the room. One member of the family holds the Bible, raised slightly. The father, mother, or other leader begins the celebration with the opening litany:

Leader: Our Lord Jesus Christ, you are the Word of the Father.

Response: Come, Lord Jesus, come.

Leader: You became one with us to tell of the Father's love.

Response: Come, Lord Jesus, come.

Leader: You are the light that shines in the darkness.

Response: Come, Lord Jesus, come.

Leader: You save us from fear and break

the bonds of sin and death.

Response: Come, Lord Jesus, come.

Leader: You come to guide our steps

and lead us to God.

Response: Come, Lord Jesus, come. **Leader:** You are the Word of eternal life.

Response: Come, Lord Jesus, come. **Leader:** You fill us with the Holy Spirit.

Response: Come, Lord Jesus, come.

As everyone enters the house or room, they may sing a suitable song. Then one of the following Scripture passages is

read from the Bible:

Matthew 4:17-23 Jesus calls and heals through the power of his Word.

Mark 4:1-20 The Word is like the seed.

Luke 4:14-21 Jesus proclaims the Word in Nazareth.

Enthrone the Bible in the Family

To show that God is at the center of their lives, many families enthrone the Bible, the Word of God, in a visible place in their homes. By placing the Sacred Scriptures in a prominent place decorated with flowers and art, and by gathering at this spot for daily prayer, families show that God is present and active through his Word.

Enthroning the Bible in your home is easy. Simply pick a place where the Bible can be honoured. The Bible should be placed where it will be seen regularly, but the location should be apart from the noise and confusion of the family entertainment. Place the Bible, opened to a favourite passage or the readings of the day (these can be found at www.usccb.org/nab), on a table or shelf. Decorate the area around the Bible with a cloth, flowers, and/or a candle-whatever makes sense to you. Use the following ritual prayer when you gather as a family to enthrone the Bible.

John 1:10-14 Jesus is the Word of God and the light of the world.

After the reading, the leader places the Bible in the place prepared for it. All bow deeply before the enthroned Bible.

Leader: We have heard your words, Jesus. They give us joy and bring light and truth into our lives. Your presence gives us peace in our troubled and divided world. Let your Word create in our hearts a deep desire for you. Be with us in our hearts and homes, in our community and country. Give us your Holy Spirit to help us to understand your Word. We enthrone now this Holy Bible in our midst. Make your Word the center of our lives. May your Word inspire all that we think and say and do. May your Word bind us together in unity with each other and with you, today and forever. Response: Amen.

All join in saying the Lord's Prayer.

All repeat after the leader:

We promise to respect the Word of God in our midst. We shall read and reflect on it as a family of God. May we draw from it inspiration for our decisions, strength for our work, and comfort in suffering. Jesus, help us to be faithful to our promise, you who live forever and ever. Amen.

The Word of God as a Source of Prayer

In Romans 8:26, St. Paul tells us, "We do not know how to pray as we ought." The news, while part of God's gracious revelation, is hardly earth shattering. It confirms something most of us already intuit: our prayer life isn't as it should be. We are easily distracted, selfish in our desires, impure in our intentions. Even the Apostles recognized these problems in themselves. Hence their petition in Luke 11:1, "Lord, teach us to pray."

In answer to their request, Jesus teaches them, and by extension all of us, what we know as the "Our Father."

In that prayer, Jesus identifies "give us this day our daily bread" as one of the petitions we should address to the Father. There are many meanings packed into this single petition, the most obvious of which (at least for Catholics) is an allusion to the Eucharist (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC], no. 2836). But there is another kind of "daily bread," which Jesus references when Satan tempts him in the desert. There, Jesus, as recorded in Matt. 4:4. rebukes Satan's invitation to turn the rocks into bread by quoting Deuteronomy 8:3: "Man does not live by bread alone, but . . . by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God"

The Eucharist is essential to human flourishing. But, as Jesus makes clear in that passage, the Word of God is just as essential to our existence and life. If we want to pray "as we ought," we need to meditate and "chew" on it daily.

The celebration concludes with a sign of peace.
