Homily for the 4th SUNDAY(Cycle B)

Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7a, 7b-9 1 Corinthians 7:32-35 Mark 1:21-28

The Theme of the Readings: Teaching with Authority

When someone speaks with "authority," those listening have confidence that the person is talking with the power of belief behind their words. Our First Reading and Gospel Reading present two men the covenant people recognized as speaking with authority because they spoke with conviction concerning God's words. Moses, the Exodus liberator and lawgiver, was God's mediator in establishing the Sinai Covenant with Israel when the Israelites followed Moses as their covenant mediator (Ex 20:18-18; Dt 5:5, 22-23). From then on, Moses addressed the people for God and spoke to God for the people and interceded for them when they deserved destruction for their sins (Ex 32:32-34; Num 14:13-20; Ps 106:23). Jesus of Nazareth came to liberate humanity from sin and death. He brought a new law in His role as the mediator of a new and superior covenant established in His Kingdom of the universal Church (Gal 3:19-20; 1 Tim 2:5; Heb 8:6; 9:15; 12:24). The Catholic ("universal") Church teaches with the authority of Jesus Christ (Jn 20:22-23).

In the **First Reading** from Moses's last series of homilies to the children of Israel, he told them God would send another prophet as a future lawgiver and covenant mediator. Moses told them the future prophet would speak the word of God, and that God commanded them to listen to him and obey or be accountable to Him for their failure.

In the **Responsorial Psalm**, we hear the invitation to come to the Lord in the Liturgy of worship. The psalm's theme is that God is our Divine King and Creator who nourishes and guides us like a shepherd cares for his flock. In the **Second Reading**, St. Paul, empowered by the Holy Spirit, taught with that same authority. He received his

In the **Gospel Reading**, the people were astonished at Jesus's teaching because He "taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." Jesus taught them with a correct understanding of Scripture and the need for the application of God's words in their lives. Even those possessed by demon spirits recognized His authority. Jesus is the promised prophet greater than Moses from the First Reading. He is the supreme prophet, lawgiver, and covenant mediator of a new and eternal covenant (Heb 8:6, 13; 9:15; 12:24; CCC 1962, 1964, 1965).

"I have no desire to place **restrictions** on you, but I do want to promote what is good, what will help you to devote yourselves entirely to the Lord." –1 Corinthians 7:35

We must accept certain **restrictions** if we wish to totally commit our lives to the Lord. Gospel poverty, celibacy, a large family, a faithful marriage, a demanding ministry – all restrict us significantly. However, any decision or commitment restricts us. Any successful athlete, business person, or celebrity has placed severe restrictions on themselves. How much more willing should we be to restrict ourselves out of love for the Lord! (see 1 Cor 9:27)

Consider what Jesus did for us. When He became a man, He emptied Himself and took the form of a slave (Phil 2:7). There is no greater restriction than to be nailed to a cross. Jesus was the most restricted person who has ever lived, but also the most free. He broke all restrictions of space and time by rising from the dead and ascending to heaven (1 Pt 3:22). Give your life completely to Jesus. <u>Be restricted and resurrected as He was.</u>

<u>Prayer:</u> Jesus, give me the freedom to be committed and self-sacrificing.

<u>Promise:</u> "The unclean spirit convulsed the man violently and with a loud shriek came out of him." –Mk 1:26
