Homily for Epiphany, Year B

Readings: Isaiah 60:1-6, Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-13, Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6, Matthew 2:1-12

On this great feast day, we hear the same readings each year. This feast is about the Gentiles coming to know the Lord. This feast is about God showing His salvation to all peoples.

The first reading, from the Prophet Isaiah, tells us of the promise of God to His people, Israel. What a wonderful reading this is! We are always expected, as Christians, to understand that we are the new Jerusalem, the new Israel. In the Church, the Lord God has shown His wonders to the people. The important words, of course, are that the nations shall walk by the light of the Lord. The nations, the pagans, the Gentiles—all of these expressions for those of us who are not Jewish by blood but who have become Israelites by faith.

The second reading, from the Letter to the Ephesians, repeats this message of the Prophet Isaiah: those who are Gentiles are also invited to share in all of the promises that were formerly made only to the Jewish people. This sharing in the promises comes about because of Jesus Christ dying and rising again—for all of us.

The Gospel of Matthew gives us the story of the Magi. Later this story becomes the story of the Three Kings, probably because of the three gifts mentioned. But these magi, these wise men from the East—no matter how many in number—come to worship the newborn child, to testify that indeed something divine has happened in the birth of Jesus. Perhaps too often it is the magi, the wise people from other cultures and lands, who show to us Christians the wonder that we have given to us in Christ Jesus. Perhaps it is the converts who show to us who have been raised as Christians the glory of the faith that has been given to us.

One of the most wonderful aspects of our Catholic faith is that it is truly universal. Today we recognize that God comes to save all people. God wants all of us to share in the divine life. God invites all of us to know His Son Jesus. Just as we have been invited to

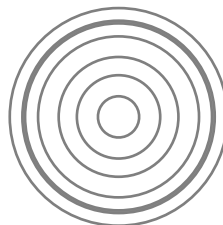

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

Epiphany means “manifestation.” The first Epiphany was the visit of the Magi to adore the Christ Child. The Magi, who were actually scholars and scientists, came to be associated with kings. Their gifts reveal this holy Child’s identity; gold for Christ’s Kingship, incense for His divinity, and myrrh for His sacrifice on the Cross.

The Feast of Epiphany is traditionally celebrated as the twelfth night of Christmas, on January 6th. In the United States, this feast has been moved to the Sunday, January 7, 2024. In many families, the king figurines are moved a bit closer to the nativity scene every day from Christmas Day until Epiphany. Moreover, it is traditional for parish priests to bless water, chalk, and incense on the eve of Epiphany, and use them for the blessing of homes the next day.

The blessing of homes (schools, places of employment, etc.) on Epiphany revives the beautiful custom of making our homes sacramentals. Sacramentals make us more mindful, receptive and cooperative with God’s grace. This blessing also reminds us that Christ is the One Who enlightens our hearts and homes with His love. He is the source of our hope, our comfort and our joy.

Marking doorways with blessed chalk is also a witness of faith. Use the chalk to mark above the main door and, if possible, over all exterior doors in the following fashion:

- ✦ Numerals to consecrate the New Year.
- ✦ Initials to remind us of the legendary names of the Magi—
- ✦ Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar—and also to represent the Latin motto: *Christus mansionem benedicat* (May Christ bless this house)
- ✦ Four crosses to represent the four seasons.
- ✦ Example for the year 2024: 20 + C + M + B + 24

Epiphany Blessing of the Home

The head of the family is the leader. All present go from room to room, blessing each room with holy water and praying the following prayer:

Blessed be all the rooms of this home. May each of them be holy and filled with the spirit of happiness and peace, love and affection. May the spirit of pardon and affection reside with us and be always ready to heal our divisions. May the spirits of joy and laughter, hope and faith, playfulness and prayer, compassion and love be perpetual guests in our home. May God’s holy blessing rest upon us all, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

As the leader inscribes the initials of the three Magi above the exterior doorways using the blessed chalk, the following prayer is prayed: Inscription for the year 2024: 20+C+M+B+24

Blessed be this doorway. May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us as we welcome them with respect and kindness. May all our comings and goings be under the seal of God’s loving care. May we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, Jesus, Who is Lord forever and ever. Amen.
