Jeremiah 23:1-6, Ephesians 2:13-18, Psalm 23:1-6, Mark 6:30-34

CHANGING SHEPHERDS

“The Lord is my Shepherd; I shall not want.” Psalm 23:1

In the Old Testament, the term “shepherds,” when used to refer to leaders, did not refer to religious leaders but secular, political leaders (see [Ez 34:1ff](#)). Thus, according to the Old Testament, our shepherds are the president, governors, senators, mayors, etc. The Lord promised to punish the shepherds of Israel for not caring for the sheep ([Jer 23:2](#)) and to replace them with a good shepherd, a king who “shall reign and govern wisely” ([Jer 23:5](#)). Jesus is that Good Shepherd-King (see [Jn 10:14](#)).

When Jesus called Himself the Good Shepherd, He implied to the Jewish people that He was a political leader, possibly a king. Jesus’ kingdom was not of this world ([Jn 18:36](#)), but very few people knew that. Therefore, when Jesus called Himself “the Good Shepherd,” He was easily misunderstood as saying something political and revolutionary. This was part of the reason Jesus was crucified by the Roman government (see [Jn 19:12-16](#)).

Even today, if you decide to follow Jesus, the Good Shepherd-King, you will be misunderstood. You will be misjudged to be a political threat to the government, especially as you proclaim international, socioeconomic freedom in Christ. Nevertheless, follow the Good Shepherd even to the cross of misunderstanding, rejection, and death.

Prayer: Jesus, Good Shepherd, raise up godly political leaders.

Promise: “He pitied them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and He began to teach them at great length. [Mk 6:34](#).”

Praise: Praise the risen Jesus, the Good Shepherd, Who brings goodness and kindness all the days of our lives ([Ps 23:6](#)).

Question: I have a Muslim friend who says that he loves Jesus too and believes that he is a prophet, but that doesn't mean there can't be other prophets after him. What should I say to him?

Answer: The Bible says that Jesus represents the fullness of God's divine revelation and so there will be no more prophets giving public revelation after him. There may be seers or people God has given private revelation, like what happened at Fatima, but there will be no more public revelation or a prophet like Moses. In fact, in Deuteronomy 18:15, Moses says, *"The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brethren—him you shall heed."* This prophet would be the Messiah.

In Acts 3:18, St. Peter quotes this verse and applies it to Jesus. He says, *"What God foretold by the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ should suffer, he thus fulfilled."* The opening verses of the letter to the Hebrews also say, *"In many and various ways God spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets; but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world."*

Jesus also distinguishes himself from just another prophet in the parable of the wicked tenants, where he describes wicked tenant farmers, or the leaders of Israel, killing hired servants who represent prophets before they finally kill the son of the owner of the vineyard, or Jesus, who is not just another prophet. This all means that the time of public prophets is at an end because God sent something greater than a prophet. He has sent his only begotten son, the person who fully possesses the divine nature just like the Father, Jesus Christ.
