## **Blessed are the poor in spirit**

"The beatitude we are promised confronts us with decisive moral choices. It invites us to purify our hearts of bad instincts and to seek the love of God above all else. It teaches us that true happiness is not found in riches or well-being, in human fame or power, or in any human achievement - however beneficial it may be - such as science, technology, and art, or indeed in any creature, but in God alone, the source of every good and of all love: All bow down before wealth. Wealth is that to which the multitude of men pay an instinctive homage. They measure happiness by wealth; and by wealth they measure respect.... It is a homage resulting from a profound faith... that with wealth he may do all things. Notoriety, or the making of a noise in the world - has come to be considered a great good in itself, and a ground of veneration" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 1723).

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven," is the first beatitude of Jesus in his Sermon on the Mount, but what does this statement mean? Fr. Léon-Dufour writes that: "Jesus asks his followers for inner detachment from temporal goods (whether they possess them or are deprived of them) in order to be able to desire and receive true riches" (Vocabulary of Biblical Theology, p. 700). However, all human beings easily become attached to the material goods of this world. One of the most impactful stories in this regard is the reform of the Carmelite Order undertaken by Saint Teresa of Jesus, known as Saint Teresa of Ávila. After several years in the Carmelite convent of the Incarnation and experiencing profound mystical encounters with Our Lord Jesus Christ, she understood that she must leave that convent and establish one "built on the basis of uncompromising poverty, at a time when all the other monasteries and convents lived on grants and gifts from noble patrons so that they could never be entirely free from a certain dependence on wealth and worldly power" (René Fulop-Miller, The Saints that moved the world, p. 387). Saint Teresa had to overcome great difficulties within the Church and society of her time to carry out the Carmelite reform that the Lord had placed in her heart. This was possible because she and the nuns who accompanied her were able to detach themselves from all material possessions of this world.

But this spirit of poverty that Jesus speaks of is not something that applies only to certain religious communities; rather, it is his proposal for life for all his followers. As one spiritual author writes: "Jesus himself was closer to the stable than to the palace. In the beginning, he was placed in a manger that belonged to others. In the end, he was laid in a tomb that belonged to others. That is his life. He has nowhere to lay his head" (Bours/Kamphaus, Passion for God, p. 83).

Question: Can I consider myself among the poor in spirit of whom Jesus speaks in his Beatitudes?

### **Parenting in the New Apostolic Age**

In the mission of family article, author Tim Gray argues that raising a Catholic family today requires intentional effort because Christians now live in a largely secular culture that often rejects Christian values. Parents can no longer assume that schools, media, or society will support their faith. Instead of being intimidated, families must see this moment as a new "apostolic age," similar to the early Church, when Christians were a small and sometimes persecuted minority.

Gray emphasizes that the family must become a refuge—a place where faith is taught, lived, and witnessed daily. Parents, especially mothers and fathers working together, are the primary educators of their children in faith and values. If children do not see and hear faith practiced at home, they are likely to abandon it.

Above all, Gray stresses that love is the most powerful witness. By loving their children, practicing virtue, forgiveness, and patience, parents show them God's love. Even if children drift away from the faith, the example of a loving, faithful family can draw them back, because the world cannot offer the lasting love and meaning that faith provides.
