Holiness

What is holiness? Speaking on this subject, the Church teaches us in the Dogmatic Constitution Lumen Gentium of the Second Vatican Council that: "To attain this perfection, believers must use their strength, according to the measure of Christ's gift [...] to dedicate themselves entirely to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbor. They will do this by following in the footsteps of Christ, conforming themselves to his image, and being obedient in all things to the will of the Father. In this way, the holiness of the People of God will bear abundant fruit, as the lives of the saints clearly show throughout the history of the Church" (n. 40). In this regard, the Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that: "The path to perfection passes through the cross. There is no holiness without renunciation and spiritual combat (cf. 2 Tim 4). Spiritual progress involves asceticism and mortification, which gradually lead to living in the peace and joy of the Beatitudes" (n. 2015). That is to say, while it is true that holiness is a fruit of God's grace within us, our personal effort is nevertheless necessary, because, as St. Augustine affirms: "God who created you without you, will not save you without you."

Pope Francis states in his Apostolic Exhortation "Rejoice and Be Glad": "To be holy, it is not necessary to be a bishop, a priest, a nun, or a monk. We are often tempted to think that holiness is reserved only for those who have the opportunity to distance themselves from ordinary occupations in order to dedicate much time to prayer. This is not the case. We are all called to be holy by living with love and offering our own witness in our daily occupations, wherever we may find ourselves" (n. 14). However, there are still many Catholic Christians who consider holiness a state of life reserved for a certain elite, even though the Church, from its origins, has taught us that we are all called to holiness and that it is necessary to attain eternal life, "for without it no one will see the Lord" (Heb 12:14).

One of the saints who most advocated for the holiness of all the baptized since the mid-20th century wrote: "In your professional work, carried out before God, faith, hope, and charity will be at stake. Its challenges, the relationships and problems that your work brings with it, will nourish your prayer. The effort to carry out your ordinary occupation will be an opportunity to live that Cross which is essential for the Christian. The experience of your weakness, the failures that always exist in every human endeavor, will give you more realism, more humility, more understanding of others. Successes and joys will invite you to give thanks and to remember that you do not live for yourselves, but for the service of others and of God" (Saint Josemaría Escrivá de Balaguer, Christ Is Passing By, 49). For this reason, the Church affirms in the Dogmatic Constitution Lumen Gentium of the Second Vatican Council: "All the faithful are therefore invited and even obliged to earnestly seek the holiness and perfection within one's own state in life" (n. 42).

Holy families are set apart.

"A family's call to holiness requires not perfection but simply making time for God and one another."

In the mission of family article, author Mike Sweeney discusses the call for Catholic families to be holy, defining holiness not as perfection, but as being set apart from a culture that conflicts with their values.

He emphasizes that parents, specifically the father as the spiritual leader and the wife as the heart of the home, they are responsible for their children's faith education, not priests or school teachers.

Some key practices suggested for a holy family life include: Prioritizing faith activities like praying the rosary and attending Mass, even when it's hard due to sports or travel. Being present with one another by setting aside distractions like phones. Focusing on consistently doing "little things" in the family and marriage.

The author concludes that his ultimate desire is for his children to become saints in heaven rather than worldly stars who abandon their faith.
