In June 2009, Asia, a 45 years old mother of five children, was harvesting berries with a group of other women farm laborers in a field in Sheikhpura. She was asked at one point to fetch water from a nearby well; she complied but stopped to take a drink with an old metal cup she had found lying next to the well. A neighbor of Asia, Musarat, who had been involved in a running feud with her family about some property damage, saw her and angrily told her that it was forbidden for a Christian to drink water from the same utensil from which Muslims drink, and that some of the other workers considered her to be unclean because she was a Christian, referring to the caste system in Pakistan Asia recounts that when they made derogatory statements about Christianity and demanded that she convert to Islam, she responded, "I believe in my religion and in Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for the sins of mankind. What did your Prophet Mohammed ever do to save mankind? And why should it be me that converts instead of you?" An argument ensued. A mob came to her house, beating her and members of her family before she was taken away by the police" (www.academia.edu).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that: We believe and confess that Jesus of Nazareth, born a Jew of a daughter of Israel at Bethlehem at the time of King Herod the Great and the emperor Caesar Augustus, a carpenter by trade, who died crucified in Jerusalem under the procurator Pontius Pilate during the reign of the emperor Tiberius, is the eternal Son of God made man. He 'came from God', 'descended from heaven', and 'came in the flesh'. For 'the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father. . . and from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace"(n. 423).

However, the reality is that many people still refuse to believe in Jesus and persecute believers, thus fulfilling in them the words of Our Lord to the disciples of Emmaus: "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke!". The great theologian and priest Ignacio Ellacuría, SJ, wrote that: "Before Jesus, I must decenter myself, that is, not make myself the center of the universe around whom everything revolves. This is very difficult for those who do not believe in Jesus. Therefore, one must believe in Him, see God in Him" (Unpublished Writings of the Young Ellacuría, Jesus Christ, Volume I, pg. 127). While the Apostle Paul was traveling to Jerusalem, he stopped in Caesarea, and the Christians of that city, knowing what could happen to him, urged him not to travel there. The apostle replied: "I am ready to be bound and killed in Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 21:13).

Question: How is my faith in Jesus? Do I truly believe that He is the Son of God who died on the cross for my sins?

For priests in crisis

Let us pray for priests going through moments of crisis in their vocation, that they may find the accompaniment they need and that communities may support them with understanding and prayer.

DDD,

Each year, the diocese allocates a quota to each parish based on each parish's income. You may have some questions regarding the DDD. I will try to answer them using the following example: Imagine the diocese as a very large family: 12 children, each with their own family. However, the twelve children, along with their parents, carry out a mission together, for which they need to contribute financially to a common fund. In this case, the parents assign a quota to each child based on their income. In this way, the family sustains itself and carries out its mission.

The Diocese of Salt Lake City is that family, the children are each parish and the Bishop is the head of the family. Now, Notre Dame de Lourdes parish was extremely financially blessed in 2025. For that reason the DDD quota for 2026 has also increased significantly, we have been assigned \$138,900.00.

This number may seem large at first but our parish was extremely blessed last year. From that amount, we as a community will be responsible only for \$38,900.00. Thank God and a generous donator who gave us \$10,000.00, for DDD, we only need to collect \$28,900.00, and the rest will be covered with part of the funds the parish received as donations last year.

How are we going to collect the \$28,900.00? I have asked Jennifer Warner and Savannah Riche to be in charge of collecting all donations for DDD in the parish. That is, you inform either of them how much you are going to donate to the DDD. You can give it to them in cash, by check, or simply let them know you will make your donation online, in which case you indicate the amount of your contribution.
