Are you ready?

"I walked through much of my life in a kind of slumber. I went to Catholic school from the time I was little until I graduated, but the faith was never something I truly lived. It was just the background music of my life.. always playing softly in the distance, but never loud enough to really hear, never close enough to actually move me. I lived for myself, for my comfort, for what pleased me in the moment. I told myself I was Catholic and in name I was, but in reality, I was just drifting through a faith I didn't yet understand.

That casual, lukewarm way of living followed me into adulthood and into my marriage. My husband and I were building a life, checking all the boxes we thought would make us happy. But even as we had what the world tells you to chase.. careers, money, plans, and goals.. there was this gnawing emptiness we couldn't shake. It was as if we were always waiting for something to finally make us feel whole, but nothing ever did.

And then, by the grace of God, we realized why. We had been chasing after things that were never meant to satisfy us in the first place. The reason this world felt so empty was because it is. Without God, without eternity, without a life anchored in Christ, everything the world offers eventually fades, leaving you restless and searching for more.

That realization was our wake-up call. My husband and I came back to the faith, but not just in name. We came back ready to live it, to let it form us, to finally allow Christ to be the center instead of the background. And in returning, we discovered the fullness of Catholicism. Not just the rituals I learned in school, but the richness of the sacraments, the beauty of the Church's teachings and the reality of a God who is alive and present.

Now, my personal mission is simple: to share that fullness with others. Because I know what it's like to live lukewarm, to drift without direction, to try to fill the God-shaped hole in my heart with the world. And I also know the joy and freedom that comes when you finally wake up, turn back and realize that Christ has been there all along, waiting to give you everything your soul was searching for" (www.yescatholic.com).

The above is, we could say, the conversion story of Anne Munley. How many Catholics like her are in our Church, who are Catholic only because their parents baptized them as children, but who have not yet made a conscious decision to live our faith? The Apostle Peter, in the second reading for this Sunday, tells us: "Beloved: Sanctify Christ as Lord in your heart. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope."

Low - Tech Parenting

The author Eric Brende argues that parenting, as we think of it today, is a relatively modern concept that emerged alongside rapid technological and social changes. In earlier times, raising children relied less on expert advice and more on natural, everyday experiences. As technology has advanced, however, it has distanced families from those experiences and from the influence of "Mother Nature."

He suggests that this shift has made parenting more complicated and less intuitive. Instead of relying on books, screens, and structured activities, he believes families benefit when they reintroduce simple, nature-centered experiences into daily life. Through personal stories, he illustrates how activities like biking, exploring outdoors, reading, and engaging in hands-on crafts helped his children grow intellectually, physically, and creatively.

The author also emphasizes that these low-tech, nature-connected experiences strengthen family bonds. Shared activities—whether outdoor adventures or creative projects at home—create opportunities for conversation, curiosity, and collaboration that technology often replaces or interrupts.

Ultimately, his message is that while modern tools and knowledge about parenting can be helpful, they shouldn't crowd out the powerful role of nature. By allowing "Mother Nature" to take a more active role, families can foster healthier development, deeper relationships, and a greater sense of joy and unity in raising children.
