On the 250 years of foundation of the United States

History is very important, among other reasons, because it shows us who we are, where we come from, and what we can learn from the successes and failures along the way. To commemorate the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States of America, we will share a brief historical overview of the Catholic Church's presence in our country.

"The Catholic faith in the United States first spread through the work of missionaries, such as the Jesuits Isaac Jogues, Jacques Marquette, and Eusebio Kino, in the 16th century. In the 1770s, the Spanish Franciscan Junípero Serra led the establishment of the mission system in California. Catholic education in the United States dates back at least to 1606, when Franciscans opened a school in what is today St. Augustine, Florida. Further north—and slightly later—Jesuits instructed devoted Native American students such as Kateri Tekakwitha (1656–1680). By the end of the 16th century, English colonists had established their own public schools, often staffed by a strongly Protestant—if not openly anti-Catholic—personnel.

Even in Maryland, founded by Catholics, Catholics were a minority; in 1677, in Newtown, the Jesuits established a preparatory school. In New Orleans, Franciscans opened a boys' school in 1718. Ursuline Sisters arrived there from France in 1727 to open an orphanage, a school for street girls, and a health center. This marked the first formal Catholic charitable organization in what is now the United States. In 1782, Catholics in Philadelphia opened St. Mary's School, considered the first parochial school in the United States. Meanwhile, the Catholic population continued to expand. By around 1776, it numbered approximately 25,000 people in Maryland, Pennsylvania, and New York State alone. Not long after the American Revolution, John Carroll—cousin of Declaration of Independence signer Charles Carroll—saw his dream of a Catholic university take root with the establishment of Georgetown in 1789.

The Bill of Rights, with the guarantee of religious freedom contained in the First Amendment, helped Catholics further cement their place in the post-revolutionary United States. John Carroll was appointed Prefect of the United States of America in 1784 and Bishop of Baltimore in 1789. Baltimore—the country's first see, or first diocese—was elevated to an archdiocese in 1808. Archbishop Carroll died in 1815. (There are now 195 Catholic dioceses and eparchies in the United States, with approximately 450 active and retired bishops). Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, established a school for poor children in Emmitsburg, Maryland, in 1809, and made the creation of parish schools her life's cause. In 1812, in rural Kentucky, Mary Rhodes, Christina Stuart, and Nancy Havern—aided by a Belgian immigrant, Father Charles Nerinckx—formed the Friends of Mary (later the Sisters of Loretto) and began teaching poor children" (www.usccb.org).

The Mind-Body-Soul of the Domestic Church

"Discipline and healthy habits in our families foster virtue, freedom and holiness."

In the article written by Jared Zimmerer, he explains that the family is called the "domestic church," meaning it should reflect the values and life of the Catholic Church. He believes that families should care for the whole person — mind, body, and soul — because all three are deeply connected. Too often, people focus only on spiritual life while ignoring mental and physical well-being, but the author says true holiness includes all aspects of human life.

The author also emphasizes the importance of discipline and healthy habits. Practices such as prayer, fasting, good conversations, reading uplifting books, serving others, and physical activity help strengthen a person's character. He compares building virtue to building muscle: repeated good actions train the will and help people grow stronger spiritually and morally.

Overall, the article teaches that holiness is formed through everyday habits and intentional living. By practicing healthy routines together, families can create a home centered on virtue, freedom, and becoming more like Christ.
