The Common priesthood.

In the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church of the Second Vatican Council, the Church teaches us that: "Christ the Lord, High Priest taken from among men, made the new people "a kingdom and priests to God the Father". The baptized, by regeneration and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, are consecrated as a spiritual house and a holy priesthood, in order that through all those works which are those of the Christian man they may offer spiritual sacrifices and proclaim the power of Him who has called them out of darkness into His marvelous light. Therefore all the disciples of Christ, persevering in prayer and praising God, should present themselves as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God. Everywhere on earth they must bear witness to Christ and give an answer to those who seek an account of that hope of eternal life which is in them.

Though they differ from one another in essence and not only in degree, the common priesthood of the faithful and the ministerial or hierarchical priesthood are nonetheless interrelated: each of them in its own special way is a participation in the one priesthood of Christ. The ministerial priest, by the sacred power he enjoys, teaches and rules the priestly people; acting in the person of Christ, he makes present the Eucharistic sacrifice, and offers it to God in the name of all the people. But the faithful, in virtue of their royal priesthood, join in the offering of the Eucharist. They likewise exercise that priesthood in receiving the sacraments, in prayer and thanksgiving, in the witness of a holy life, and by self-denial and active charity" (n.10).

But, who are the lay faithful in the Catholic Church? Pope St. John Paul II, explained in his Apostolic Exhortation *Christifideles Laici*, as follows: "is here understood to mean all the faithful except those in Holy Orders and those who belong to a religious state sanctioned by the Church. Through Baptism the lay faithful are made one body with Christ and are established among the People of God. They are in their own way made sharers in the priestly, prophetic and kingly office of Christ. They carry out their own part in the mission of the whole Christian people with respect to the Church and the world", on this regard he quotes Pope Pio XII, "The Faithful, more precisely the lay faithful, find themselves on the front lines of the Church's life; for them the Church is the animating principle for human society. Therefore, they in particular, ought to have an ever-clearer consciousness *not only of belonging to the Church, but of being the Church*, that is to say, the community of the faithful on earth under the leadership of the Pope, the head of all, and of the Bishops in communion with him. These *are the Church*" (n. 9)

In today's gospel Jesus said: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for this harvest". This invitation from Jesus requires us to get involved, to intentionally commit ourselves to his mission of announcing to others the Gospel that he has entrusted to his Church.

Question: Do I know who I am and what my mission is as lay faithful in the Catholic Church?

Look to the End

In the article written by Father Joseph Illo, his main message is that death is a natural and unavoidable part of life, but Catholics should not fear it if they are spiritually prepared. He believes that preparation for death should not begin only when someone is seriously ill or nearing the end of life. Instead, people should spend their lives growing closer to God through prayer, regular confession, receiving the sacraments, and performing good works.

The author shares a personal experience at the tomb of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, where he says he lost his fear of death after realizing that death is not the end but the beginning of eternal life with God. He also includes stories from his ministry to illustrate the peace and grace that can come to those who are spiritually prepared for death.

A major point of the article is the importance of receiving the Church's sacraments at the end of life, especially confession, anointing of the sick, and viaticum (final Holy Communion). The author encourages readers to make practical preparations as well, such as informing family members of their wishes regarding last rites.

Overall, the author wants readers to understand that while death may be difficult, it should not be feared. By living a faithful life and remaining spiritually prepared, Catholics can face death with confidence, trusting that it is a passage to eternal life and union with God.
