It happened in one of the concentration camps during the Second World War, on the night of August 3, 1941. A prisoner escaped from the section to which Father Maximilian Kolbe was assigned. In revenge, the camp commandant ordered ten prisoners to be chosen at random for execution. All the men were lined up in front of the commandant, who pointed with his finger at those who were to die of starvation in the cellars of death. When he pointed to the Polish sergeant Franciszek Gajowniczek, the man walked to the front weeping over his fate and, between sobs, said: "Goodbye, goodbye, my poor wife! Goodbye, my little children, my orphaned children!" Upon seeing that heartbreaking scene, Father Kolbe, as recounted by one of the witnesses, Dr. Niceto F. Wlodarski, said: "After the selection of the ten prisoners, Father Maximilian stepped out of the line, removed his cap, and stood at attention before the commandant. Surprised, the commandant turned to the priest and said, 'What does this Polish pig want?' Father Maximilian, pointing his hand at F. Gajowniczek, who had already been selected for death, replied, 'I am a Polish Catholic priest; I am elderly; I want to take his place, because he has a wife and children...' After a moment, the commandant shouted, 'Out! Get out!' and ordered Gajowniczek to return to his line. Thus, Father Maximilian Maria Kolbe took the condemned man's place." Those condemned to die of hunger and thirst descended to the death cellar. Ten days after their sentencing, finding Father Kolbe still alive, the Nazis administered a lethal injection on August 14, 1941.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says to his apostles: "Fear no one. Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna". This does not mean that we can or should be completely indifferent to any situation of physical or spiritual danger. In fact, all human beings experience fear in our life. Therefore, what Jesus wants to teach us is the virtue of which the Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks: "The virtue of fortitude enables one to conquer fear, even fear of death, and to face trials and persecutions. It disposes one even to renounce and sacrifice his life in defense of a just cause" (n. 1808).

A good film to better understand this Sunday's Gospel is "Of Gods and Men," which tells the story of the peaceful life of a group of monks in a Cistercian monastery on Mount Atlas. They carry out their work of study and cultivating the land, and minister to the local population, mostly Muslim, until the day a group of Islamic fanatics threatens them, presenting the monks with the dilemma of facing the real danger of violent death or retreating to a safer area.

Question: How far am I willing to go to sacrifice my life for the cause of God?

A Father's Field

In "A Father's Field," author Mike Phelan compares fatherhood to farming, emphasizing that both require patience, dedication, and trust that hard work will eventually produce meaningful results. He explains that fathers spend years nurturing their children through love, discipline, guidance, encouragement, and sacrifice, often without receiving immediate rewards or recognition. Unlike modern society, which often focuses on instant gratification and visible success, fatherhood involves investing in a child's future and waiting to see the impact of that effort over time. Phelan argues that the greatest rewards of fatherhood are not trophies, praise, or public acknowledgment, but the personal and lasting influence a father has on his children's lives.

To support this idea, the author shares a personal experience from a camping trip with his son Liam and other fathers. During a blessing ceremony, Liam unexpectedly hugged him tightly and would not let go, creating a powerful emotional moment that made the author realize how much his son valued and loved him. That simple act of affection became evidence that his years of parenting were bearing fruit. Reflecting on that memory and on his son's upcoming marriage, Phelan recognizes that the true reward of fatherhood is seeing children grow into loving, responsible, and virtuous adults. Through this comparison to farming, he encourages fathers to remain faithful in their role, trusting that their efforts will eventually produce a rich and meaningful harvest in the lives of their children.
