In the heart of rural America, in an agricultural corner of Oklahoma, a boy with calloused hands and a simple gaze was born in 1935. His name was Stanley Rother, and what no one imagined was that, years later, he would become the first priest martyr and born in the United States, murdered out of hatred for the faith, not in his homeland, but in an indigenous village in Guatemala. Stanley grew up among crops, livestock, and a Catholic family where faith was as tangible as the land they plowed. He learned early on that work is prayer when done with humility. In his teens, he felt a calling to the priesthood. But his formation wasn't easy. His studies, especially Latin, caused him to stumble to the point of being expelled from the seminary. Many would have given up. He didn't. He transferred to another seminary, persevered, and was ordained a priest in 1963, at the age of 28.

But his vocation wouldn't be fully revealed in the churches of Oklahoma, but rather in the mountains of Guatemala. In 1968, Stanley volunteered to serve at the diocesan mission in Santiago Atitlán, a predominantly Tz'utujil indigenous region, where they spoke their own language and lived in poverty and neglect. There, Father Stanley didn't arrive with a sense of superiority or with answers, but with an open heart, ready to learn. He learned Spanish and then the complex Tz'utujil language. He celebrated and preached Mass in their language and accompanied them in their daily lives. He founded a clinic, an agricultural school, a community radio station, and translated the New Testament with local leaders. He won everyone's affection, not as a foreigner, but as one of the people, known to all as "Father A'Plas," Father Francisco.

But the context in which he lived was becoming increasingly dangerous. The Guatemalan civil war was raging. Catechists were disappearing, community leaders were being murdered, and the Church, which accompanied the poor, was seen as a threat. Father Stanley was also threatened. He knew he was being watched. Even so, he decided to stay. One day he wrote: "The pastor does not flee at the first sign of danger. The pastor must be with his people." And so it was. In the early morning of July 28, 1981, armed men stormed his rectory. They looked for him by name. He did not flee. They killed him in his room, with a shot to the head. His blood mingled with the soil of the town to which he had dedicated his life. His body was returned to the United States, but his heart—literally—remains buried beneath the altar of the church in Santiago Atitlán, as a sign of his definitive belonging to his people" (www.misionerostrinitariosvocaciones.org).

Question: What does this phrase of Jesus in today's Gospel mean to me: "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it"?

The Mind-Body-Soul of the Domestic Church

Discipline and healthy habits in our families foster virtue, freedom and holiness.

In the article written by Jared Zimmerer, he explains that the family, which he calls the “domestic church,” should care for the whole person by nurturing the mind, body, and soul. According to the author, discipline through activities such as prayer, fasting, exercise, and intentional choices about media and entertainment helps build virtue and strengthens character. He also emphasizes that the body and soul are united, citing Catholic teaching that both are important aspects of the human person.

Therefore, families should develop positive habits together, such as praying, reading uplifting books, exercising, and serving others, because these practices promote holiness, freedom, and a stronger family life.

Overall, the author’s message is that caring for the mind, body, and soul together helps families grow closer to God and become healthier and more virtuous.
