What is your treasure?

"Fr. Daniel Reehil was once a successful banker thriving in the high-stakes world of Wall Street finance. He enjoyed the luxuries of a prosperous career—working for companies like American Express and Citicorp in global trade—yet beneath the surface, he felt a deep emptiness. He struggled with nightmares, prolonged insomnia, and a profound sense of dissatisfaction despite his material success. One summer, while renting a house in Amalfi, Italy, a friend suddenly expressed a strong desire to visit Medjugorje, the small Bosnian village famous for reported apparitions of the Virgin Mary to six children. Just across the Adriatic Sea, it was an easy trip, so Daniel agreed to join her. That pilgrimage in 1998 changed everything. In Medjugorje, despite his long absence from the Church (over 20 years), Daniel experienced an overwhelming sense of peace after a full night's sleep—the first in months. The next day, he went to confession for the first time in two decades. During that sacrament, the priest who heard his confession told him he believed Daniel had a vocation to the priesthood. Those words planted the seeds of his calling.

Over the following years, Daniel discerned his vocation more deeply. He participated in several vocation pilgrimages led by Fr. Charles Mangano and Rosemarie Marando. After the events of September 11, 2001, he left New York City and moved to Boston to explore diocesan priesthood under the guidance of a mentor priest, Fr. Tom DiLorenzo. He later spent time as a contemplative hermit before completing his seminary formation at Holy Apostles College & Seminary. In the mid-2000s, Bishop David Choby of Nashville invited him to the Diocese of Nashville, where he felt at home.

Fr. Reehil was ordained a priest on July 26, 2014. He served as Parochial Vicar and then Pastor at St. Edward Parish, later becoming Pastor of St. Catherine of Siena Parish in Columbia, TN (starting in 2020), where he also serves as Vicar Forane (Dean) of the Southern Deanery. He is the exorcist for the Diocese of Nashville, trained in Rome and elsewhere in spiritual warfare and deliverance ministry. Additionally, since 2020, he has been the National Director of Radio Maria USA, hosting the daily program *Battle Ready with Fr. Dan Reehil*, where he discusses faith, scripture, and spiritual battles"(www.yescatholic.com).

When the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream, he said, "Solomon, ask me for whatever you want, and I will give it to you." Taking Kids Seriously

"When answering children's questions about
the faith, Catholic parents need to understand
their point of view."

In the article "Taking Kids Seriously" the
author Steven R. Hemler says that parents,
grandparents, teachers, godparents, and other
Catholic role models have an important
responsibility to help children understand and
grow in their faith. Because many people are
leaving the Catholic Church, the author believes
it is especially important for adults to answer
children's questions about God and Catholic
teachings with care and patience. Children often
ask difficult questions about topics such as
God's existence, suffering, science and faith,
Jesus' resurrection, attending Mass, and moral
issues. Although there are many resources
available to help explain these topics, the
author says that having the right answers is only
part of the job.

According to the author, children are more
likely to develop a strong faith when they feel
loved, respected, and safe enough to express
their doubts and concerns without fear of being
judged. Parents should practice active listening
by paying close attention, asking thoughtful
follow-up questions, and trying to understand
what their child is thinking and feeling before
giving advice. The author emphasizes that faith
is a lifelong journey that takes time to develop,
so parents should not expect immediate results.
Instead, they should continue showing love,
encouraging open conversations, praying for the
guidance of the Holy Spirit, and trusting God to
work in their children's lives. By creating a
supportive and understanding environment,
parents can help their children build a lasting
and meaningful Catholic faith.
