The Battle of Prayer

"Prayer is both a gift of grace and a determined response on our part. It always presupposes effort. The great figures of prayer of the Old Covenant before Christ, as well as the Mother of God, the saints, and he himself, all teach us this: prayer is a battle. Against whom? Against ourselves and against the wiles of the tempter who does all he can to turn man away from prayer, away from union with God. We pray as we live, because we live as we pray. If we do not want to act habitually according to the Spirit of Christ, neither can we pray habitually in his name. The "spiritual battle" of the Christian's new life is inseparable from the battle of prayer.

In the battle of prayer, we must face in ourselves and around us erroneous notions of prayer. Some people view prayer as a simple psychological activity, others as an effort of concentration to reach a mental void. Still others reduce prayer to ritual words and postures. Many Christians unconsciously regard prayer as an occupation that is incompatible with all the other things they have to do: they "don't have the time." Those who seek God by prayer are quickly discouraged because they do not know that prayer comes also from the Holy Spirit and not from themselves alone.

We must also face the fact that certain attitudes deriving from the mentality of "this present world" can penetrate our lives if we are not vigilant. For example, some would have it that only that is true which can be verified by reason and science; yet prayer is a mystery that overflows both our conscious and unconscious lives. Others overly prize production and profit; thus prayer, being unproductive, is useless. Still others exalt sensuality and comfort as the criteria of the true, the good, and the beautiful; whereas prayer, the "love of beauty" (philokalia), is caught up in the glory of the living and true God. Finally, some see prayer as a flight from the world in reaction against activism; but in fact, Christian prayer is neither an escape from reality nor a divorce from life.

Finally, our battle has to confront what we experience as failure in prayer: discouragement during periods of dryness; sadness that, because we have "great possessions," we have not given all to the Lord; disappointment over not being heard according to our own will; wounded pride, stiffened by the indignity that is ours as sinners; our resistance to the idea that prayer is a free and unmerited gift; and so forth. The conclusion is always the same: what good does it do to pray? To overcome these obstacles, we must battle to gain humility, trust, and perseverance"(Catechism of the Catholic Church, nn. 2725-2728).

Learn to Listen

In the article "Learn to Listen" the author Tom Hoops explains that one of the biggest challenges of parenting is learning to adjust when children become adults. He believes parents should stop seeing their children as people they own or control and instead recognize them as independent individuals who belong to God and are responsible for their own lives. The author shares his personal experience of hearing criticism from his adult children, admitting that although it was difficult, it helped him realize mistakes he had made and changed the way he viewed parenting. He points to research showing that many adult children become estranged from their parents because they feel unsupported, dismissed, or hurt by toxic behaviors. To prevent this, parents should avoid trying to fix every problem or giving unsolicited advice and instead respect their children's independence while offering guidance only when it is welcomed. The author also emphasizes that parents must learn to accept feedback without becoming defensive, since their adult children are often repeating concerns they have expressed for years. Above all, he argues that listening is the most important parenting skill, not just during childhood but throughout adulthood. By listening with humility, empathy, and love, parents can build relationships based on mutual respect and trust, helping them maintain a close and healthy bond with their children for the rest of their lives.
