Jewish or Catholic Church?

"This was precisely the great obstacle the early Church had to overcome: was Christianity a branch of Judaism, or was it something new? In other words, how did Christianity become independent of its local roots and become a universal religion? Our religion is called Catholic, that is, universal. However, this universalism was not immediately understood by everyone. This fragmentation constituted the first major obstacle the Church encountered at the dawn of its existence. What attitude should be taken toward the Old Law, toward Israel? It seemed obvious, then, that for the first Christians, all or almost all of Jewish origin, the Church was nothing other than an extension of Israel, a new branch sprouting from the chosen people. The Church was Jewish: its divine founder was Jewish, its mother was Jewish, the apostles were Jewish, its first members were Jewish. When the apostle said, "Men of Israel, listen to these words," he was speaking exclusively to Jews. And later, when the disciples of Jesus traveled throughout Palestine, stopped only in cities with Jewish communities. They went to the synagogues and there announced that the Messiah they had been waiting for had arrived: none other than Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of Mary. As we can see, the Church was deeply rooted in the Synagogue.

This would be the first great crossroads in the history of the Church. Would Christianity, assimilated into Israel, become a national religion? The bond between the Church and the Synagogue would only be broken by a sign from heaven and due to an absolute impossibility, when the authority of the Synagogue, until then respected, formally rejected the Good News, theologically consummating its hostility: "I now realize that it is true that treats everyone on the the same basis. Those who fear him and do what is right are acceptable to him, no matter what race they belong to" (Acts 10:34-35). The circumcised faithful were greatly astonished to see a Gentile, who had not been circumcised, which means without passing through the Synagogue, entering in the Church. The Church will not be a group within the Israelite nation, but a universal community, where Jews and Gentiles who accept the Good News will meet fraternally, without distinction of race. The mission of Israel as the people of God has ended, since it has been superseded by the Church, spiritual Israel, composed of all the faithful, Jews or Gentiles.

The Council of Jerusalem saved Christianity in the first great storm of its history, declaring that the Church would be catholic, that is, universal" (Alfredo Sáenz, The Primitive Church, the Persecutions, Arianism, pp. 29-45). All of the above appears in a veiled way in this Sunday's reading: the prophet Isaiah speaks to foreigners, Saint Paul refers to non-Jews, and Our Lord concludes by admiring the faith of a Canaanite woman.

Domestic Missionaries

The author, Deacon Rolando Moreno, explains that being a missionary does not always mean traveling to distant places to spread the Gospel. Instead, one of the most important places to practice and share faith is within the home. He describes the Catholic family as a "mission field" because parents and spouses have a responsibility to help one another and their children grow closer to God. Just as Jesus sent his disciples out to share the Good News, married couples are called to live as disciples by making their homes places where faith is practiced every day.

The author emphasizes that parents have a major role in passing their faith on to their children. They can do this by praying together, attending Mass, receiving the sacraments, and showing their children through their actions what it means to follow Jesus. He also points out that faith should not only be something talked about on Sundays; it should be part of everyday family life. Even simple things such as supporting one another, forgiving each other, working together, and trusting God can become ways of teaching and living the faith.

Overall, the author's main message is that the family has an important mission to live and share the Catholic faith. A strong Christian home can influence children, strengthen marriages, and ultimately have an impact on the larger community and society. By making faith a central part of their daily lives, spouses can become missionaries to the people closest to them—especially their own families.
